Goals

The purpose of camp pringle is to provide a retreat for music students where they can focus on learning music in an uninterrupted environment. Students must be inclusive and support each other throughout the retreat. Students will have a chance to work one on one with professional musicians, and the opportunity to work with two of Victoria's greatest band and choral directors. Our hope is that all students will grow together through music, and make new friends in the process.

Expectations

It is crucial that all students take time to have fun and enjoy the camp. In order to do so, we must adhere to rules and responsibilities. Parents and students must sign "**The three strikes system**". It is important that we are on our best behavior and be strong ambassadors of both SD64 and Salt Spring Island Middle School. Students who refuse to do so will follow through with the strike system. There will be 8 chaperones and teachers on the trip. Please contact me if you would like to be a chaperone.

Accommodation

Students will be sleeping in one of two building. They are designed like dormitories. Students will need to bring sleeping bags, pillows, and warm clothing for sleeping. Buildings will be separated with girls being in one building, and boys being in another. If students enter the sleeping quarters of another gender, they will automatically receive three strikes.

THE THREE STRIKES SYSTEM

RULES work on a three strikes system. Examples are as follows:

A student will receive a strike for:

- being late for a scheduled meeting time. If you are late everyone must wait for you and since *time is money* you are forcing everyone to miss out on activities they have already paid for.

- being noisy in a hotel or dorm and being disrespectful towards a chaperone who has already asked you to be quiet.

- being disrespectful of those people we come in contact with throughout our trip.

- Using s cell phone during rehearsal or inappropriately during the trip.

After one strike a student will receive a strong warning that that type of behavior will not be tolerated.

If the student receives a second strike then we will phone home and make the parent/guardians aware of the situation and give them the opportunity to discuss it with their son/daughter. They will be reminded of the consequences of receiving the third strike.

If the student still has not got the message and earns a third strike then we will phone home again. This time it will be to tell the parent/guardians to pick up their child and take them home immediately.

Some activities are automatically escalated to strike three:

- breaking the law
- possession of alcohol or any illegal drug
- being in a hotel or dorm room of someone of the opposite sex
